Science

Materials - Materials are what objects are made from.

Suitability - Suitability mean having the properties which are right for a specific purpose.

Properties - This is what a material is like and how it behaves (soft, stretchy, waterproof)

Squash an object by pushing both hands together.



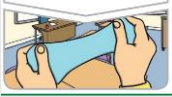
Bend an object by grabbing both ends of the object and bringing the ends inwards together.



Twist an object by turning your hands in opposite directions.



Stretch an object by pulling your hands slowly and gently apart.

Freestanding - not attached or supported by another structure.

Strong - able to withstand force.

Rigid - Unable to bend or be forced out of shape.
